18 innovative companies across the island shortlisted for prestigious awards

The search for the most innovative organisations across the island, North and South, is one step closer with the announcement today of the shortlist of 18 organisations selected for The Irish Times InterTradeIreland Innovation Awards, now in its fifth year.

The Prizes

The winners will be announced at an awards ceremony on Wednesday 9^{th} April 2014 in Dublin. Each category winner will secure a $\\ensuremath{\in} 10,000$ media package with The Irish Times and an iPad. They will then compete to win the overall title of 'Innovation of the Year', which awards the winner with a communications and advertising package from The Irish Times, worth $\\ensuremath{\in} 150,000$. In addition, a UCD scholarship for an Executive Education programme commencing in 2015 and a state of the art laptop .

Silver Hill Foods, Monaghan, awarded InterTradeIreland Exemplar award for innovative 'duck' project

InterTradeIreland's all-island technology transfer and innovation programme, FUSION, partners companies north and south with a third-level institution providing them with the specialist expertise of a high calibre graduate working directly in the organisation to deliver a new product or process improvement project.

Through the programme, Monaghan based Silver Hill Foods were partnered with the University of Ulster to help address the problem of waste management.

The Project

Reducing waste and disposal costs created an opportunity for the business to develop new innovative quality products for high end markets using sustainable bi-products from duck farming. This is where InterTradeIreland FUSION support came in.

The company employed fashion graduate Karen Toner who helped the company to create innovative design solutions for the high end fashion market, creating natural thermal jackets using Silver Hills pure duck down and combining Irish artist and designer Helen Steele's fine art prints into digital printed designs for the thermal outerwear jackets.

What the support meant to the company

According to Helen Steele, Creative Director of Helen Steele (fashion brand) and Director of Silver Hills: "Through InterTradeIreland's FUSION programme we were able to take our project to the next level. We were selling large quantities of our duck down internationally which was used to manufacture natural thermal jackets,

Karen's project focussed on competitor and market analysis, designing samples and new product development. The result is that we now use our duck down to make natural thermal jackets locally, Karen was instrumental in developing the project.

The academic support provided by Janet Coulter, Senior Lecturer in Fashion Design, University of Ulster was vital to our project. The use of the University of Ulster's technical equipment and lab was integral to the research of our smart tech fabrics. Ms. Coulter's extensive research and passion for this area of the industry has been both inspirational and extremely helpful. Her supervision on this project helped us to bring our product to market quicker than projected.'
